Is it because God is invisible that we cannot see Him? Or is it because He is Heaven and we are earth? Or is it simply because God is not part of our field of vision that we cannot see Him? We don't see God, so why do our eyes tell us 'He's not here'? But if God is, was, and will be forever, how could He not be in all places?

If God is in everything we touch, if He is in everything we see, if He is in everything we hear, in everything we breathe, in everything we experience... how could He not be in our field of vision? Why can't we see God?

The only reason we cannot see God is very simple: we cannot see God because He does not want to be seen. His Desire to extend Himself is not to replicate Himself eternally, but to have company. Only in this way, without seeing His 'Appearance,' can we create in Perfect Freedom. To create something entirely new, without any precedent. This is the Power present in 'His Image and Likeness': He is our Freedom, our Light, our Greatness and all, all our Creative Force, so that we may be free, without forms or moulds, to create only from our desire.

God's Will is Communion. He, united with each one of us, whole in our Individuality... each in His Own Way. And is not our Will precisely the desire to remember Who we are? And does not our Individuality reside in the Remembrance of our true Identity? Thus, He is all of Existence. He is, was, and will eternally be... God, our Hidden Treasure.
